### SAN FRANCISCO CLASSES

#### AutoCAD & Quick-Pen 3-D Piping Program – Starts Wednesday, 9/13/06

This two-night course (Wednesday & Thursday) offers beginning instruction in AutoCAD drawing, including architectural drawing and detailing mechanical systems. Also offered is advance instruction on the Quick-Pen 3-D Piping Drawing Program. Prerequisites for this course: basic computer skills and knowledge of Microsoft Windows. **Instructor: Mike Galliano.**

#### Backflow Testing Certificate / Backflow Survey Specialist/ Valve Repair – Starts Monday, 9/11/06

This course will train Journeymen in:

- 1) Backflow Certification – the testing of backflow devices so student will qualify for an AWWA Certification; or
- 2) Backflow Survey Specialist – course will certify and instruct on how to survey buildings for the proper backflow devices. You must have a Backflow Testing Certification in order to take this course; or
- 3) Backflow valve repair – course will instruct on how to repair backflow prevention devices.

\* The course will conclude with a proctored examination that will be conducted on a Saturday date to be determined. **Instructor: Gene Sheffield.**

#### Beginning Computer Course – Starts Tuesday, 9/12/06

This course includes hands on instruction in computer hardware, software, uses and applications. **Instructor: Rob Weinstein.**

#### Boiler Controls & Code – Starts Thursday, 9/14/06

This course includes instruction on basic electricity, furnaces, hydronic heating, steam heating and related electronic controls and systems. **Instructor: Ray Malfatti.**

## Accident Victim Makes Dramatic Safety Presentation to Local 38 Apprentices

**F**or United Association member Sean George safety isn't just a matter of life and death. It's more important than that.

George, the victim of an horrendous natural gas explosion at 19 years old, now brings his special brand of evangelism to UA training programs—as well as other trade organization—throughout the United States and Canada. In October, standing in front of a 10-foot tall sign reading "THINK!" he brought his message to the apprentices of Local 38.

### A MOVING STORY

In just over an hour, George, a riveting speaker, detailed his accident and recovery for more than 200 Local 38 apprentices. He walked his audience through not only the shock and pain of the accident itself, but the devastating emotional and physical impact the second-long event had on his life, his family and his friends.

"I was just a kid anxious to get my day's work done so I could hit my Friday night party," George told his audience. Instead he wound up spending six weeks in the hospital and the rest of his life coping with the physical and emotional trauma of his accident.

degree burns over 80 percent of his body, of the physical and emotional toll of his physical disability and disfigurement, and perhaps most movingly, of the impact on his mother, father and brother.

"This isn't a graphic presentation," said George, before the show. "I don't show lots of pictures of burned flesh. But it is emotionally very intense. I've had people who had to leave the presentation because they couldn't handle it."

### IMPACT AND AWARENESS

Indeed, everyone in the Local 38 audience sat quietly in rapt attention during George's presentation. And George himself, as well as his message remained on everyone's mind well after the presentation.

"This guy was really intense," a Local 38 apprentice was overheard saying several days later, "I'll tell you, when I'm on the job he comes to mind. It really makes me pay attention."

### EMOTIONAL INTENSITY

Striving to drive home the importance of every aspect of job safety, George and his accompanying slide show—surprisingly non-graphic—tell in excruciating detail of his recovery as a burn victim with third
