Welding Training and Certifications Offered

The Local 38 Training Department is currently offering certifications in all welding procedures at both their San Francisco and Santa Rosa Training Facilities.

The two schools were officially designated Authorized Training Facilities by the United Association, following an inspection conducted during the recent North American Training Conference.

"We are very excited about this certification," said Local 38 Training Director Steve Mazzola. "We believe that welding, including the latest state-of-the-art high tech processes, will provide Local 38 members with a lot of work in the future.

"Welders have always been in high demand in the trades," Mazzola continued, "and with the new piping technologies we are seeing throughout the industry, that demand is only going to increase.

"Being able to turnout well trained welders certified in all processes in the industry will open the

door to a lot of work for Local 38 members and contractors."

CLASS SCHEDULE

Welders interested in becoming certified can attend training and certification programs in **Santa Rosa on Monday and Wednesday from 8 a.m.-3 p.m., and Tuesday from 12:30-5 p.m., or in San Francisco on Thursday from 12-8 p.m.**

The classes are open attendance programs with multilevel individualized instruction and full practice facilities. The program is open to all interested members, regardless of their level of welding proficiency. Once a welder is up to speed, they can take the certification test in either facility.

The classes are taught by welding instructors Steve Costerouse, and Kevin Dimic, who are both Au-

thorized Testing Representatives (ATR) and Certified Welding Inspectors (CWI).

Becoming an ATR required both Dimic and Costerouse to undertake 40 hours of instruction offered by the United Association in Ann Arbor, while becoming CWIs required them to attend an 8-day course taught by the American Welding Society.

The Training Department will also offer two additional new classes in the upcoming semester; a Green Systems Awareness Certification and a Foreman Training Class.

FREE BENEFIT

Local 38's Training Department also offers a full range of Supplementary Journeyman classes designed to provide hands-on instruction in the latest tools, technology and techniques available to pipe trades workers in the field.

All classes are free to Local 38 members, and are filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

The deadline to register for Supplementary Journeyman Classes for the upcoming Spring 2010 semester is Monday, December 28, 2009.

If you do not see a class covering a specific subject of interest, make a suggestion in the space provided on the Registration Form. The Training Department is constantly reviewing and revising the current class offerings to meet the changing needs of our members and the industry.

Journeyman Classes Spring 2010

The following are the Supplementary Journeyman Training Classes that will be offered through the Local 38 Training Department during the 2010 Spring Semester. To register, please contact the Local 38 Training Department by telephone at 415-626-2000, by Monday, December 28, 2009. Please indicate which classes you are interested in attending. Classes will begin as indicated below:

SAN FRANCISCO CLASSES

CAD Mech, AutoCAD & Quick-Pen 3-D Piping Program – Starts Monday, 1/4/10

This two-night course (Mondays & Wednesdays) offers instruction in CAD Mech and AutoCAD drawing, including architectural drawing and detailing mechanical systems. Also offered is instruction on the Quick-Pen 3-D Piping Drawing Program. Prerequisites for this course: basic computer skills and knowledge of Microsoft Windows. Instructor: Mike Galliano.

Backflow Testing Certification/ Backflow Survey Specialist/ Valve Repair – Starts Monday, 1/4/10

This two-night course (Mondays & Wednesdays) will train Journeymen in:
1) Backflow Certification – the testing of backflow devices so student will qualify for an AWWA Certification; or
2) Backflow Survey Specialist – course will certify and instruct on how to survey buildings for the proper backflow devices. You must have a Backflow Testing Certification in order to take this course; or
3) Backflow valve repair – course will instruct on how to repair backflow prevention devices.

The course will conclude with a proctored examination that may be conducted on a Saturday date to be determined. Instructor: Dan McCormick III

Boiler Controls & Code – Starts Thursday, 1/7/10

This course includes instruction on basic electricity, furnaces, hydronic heating, steam heating and related electronic controls and systems including hands-on instruction using the Hampden Steam Boiler Trainer. Instructor: Bill Flanery

HVAC/R– Starts Tuesday, 1/5/10

This two-night course (Tuesdays & Thursdays) will focus on complete Air Conditioning Systems including; system components, cooling capacity & energy efficiency, diagnosing and troubleshooting of equipment. Instructor: Rich Beaumont.

HVAC/R – Starts Tuesday, 1/5/10

This two-night course (Tuesdays & Thursdays) will focus on Building Automation & Controls including; full requirements of systems, maintenance & operation, diagnosis, adjustments & calibration. Instructor: James Comte.

Medical Gas Certification – Starts Wednesday, 1/6/10

This course will train students in Medical Gas technology, using the 2005 NFPA 99C manual, so they will qualify for their Medical Gas Installation and Brazing Certificate from National, ITC. Instructors: Steve Robertson & Chris Beerling.

Welding Course – Starts Monday, 1/4/10, Instructor Available Monday Evenings

This course provides multilevel instruction in all techniques of welding towards obtaining a UA Welder Certification. Weld testing conducted at our facility. Instructor: Bud Marryatt

This 20-hour course deals with understanding of building's systems and their interrelation with each other to create a single building system that conserves our resources, is sustainable and lowers maintenance costs. The curriculum discusses HVAC, Refrigeration, Plumbing and electrical components. Instructor: Bill Flanery

This course will deal with several topics as it relates to Foreman responsibilities such as; quality, safety, cost effectiveness, direction of personnel, record and material handling and other key elements pertaining to Foreman. Instructor: Buck Hughes

Election 2010

Local 38 Hosts Fundraiser for Insurance Commissioner Candidate Alioto-Pier

More than 30 Bay Area labor and building trades leaders gathered at Local 38's San Francisco headquarters this month to hear San Francisco Supervisor Michela Alioto-Pier discuss her candidacy for California Insurance Commissioner in the June 2010 primary election.

Alioto-Pier is one of three democrats who have announced their candidacy for the Insurance Commissioner's office next year. Also running are Patty Berg, who served in the State Assembly from 2002 to 2008, and current Assemblyman David Jones.

"I understand that all three of the announced candidates for Insurance Commissioner are friendly to labor," said Local 38 Business Manager Larry Mazzola, Sr., when introducing Alioto-Pier, "but we're backing Michela because of the support she has shown us as a member of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors. She has proven to be a strong supporter of Local 38, the building trades and labor as a whole, one who is willing to listen to us and fight for our needs."

A LABOR TRADITION

Mazzola, along with many of the other labor leaders on hand also stated another reason for their support of Alioto-Pier, that she is Joe Alioto's granddaughter. "Joe Alioto was the best labor mayor San Francisco ever had," Mazzola said. "When he was mayor we had labor representatives on every San Francisco board and commission. We need that kind of representation in Sacramento, and with Michela we will get that."

IMPORTANT ISSUES

Alioto-Pier told an appreciative audience that her personal experience has proven how important the Insurance Commissioner is to the lives of Californians. "The insurance industry is essentially placing a bet, and they have an enormous bureaucracy in place whose only purpose is to make sure you never collect on a claim," she said. "It's just not right."

Not only has Alioto-Pier heard stories from numerous San Franciscans about their insurance nightmares--particularly health insurance denials--she has experienced them first hand as a disabled person. "I'm using a 10-year old wheelchair," she said, "because I know what a nightmare it is to try and get a new one through my health insurance plan."

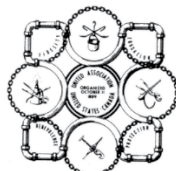
WORKERS COMPENSATION

Alioto-Pier also cited Workers' Compensation fraud as a major issue facing the Insurance Commissioner. "This is one of the key issues facing employers throughout California," Alioto-Pier said. "This has become the number one type of insurance fraud, and we need the Insurance Commissioner to step in and enforce our anti-fraud laws."

Records at the California State Pipe Trades Council office indicate that Local 38 is authorized to elect 10 delegates.

IMPORTANT: No member shall be eligible as a Delegate or Alternate unless he/she shall have been a member in good standing for a period of at least one year immediately prior to the election. No Delegate shall be eligible to hold office in the California State Pipe Trades Council who is not eligible to hold office in his/her own Local Union. The United Association Constitution shall prevail.
